## **SUMMARY:**

The San Joaquin Regional Affordability Seminar will be the first in the 2017 speaker series - and is part of a collaboration effort between SJCOG and the University of the Pacific Center for Business and Policy Research (CBPR). This first seminar of the year will feature Dr. Thomas Pogue and Dr. Jeff Michael from UOP CBPR for an update on emerging trends in housing, income, and commuting – and their impact on regional housing and transportation affordability. There is no cost to participants.

The purpose of this seminar is to provide policy makers, local government officials, planners, and citizens with the information they need to tackle regionally specific issues dealing with provision of housing affordable to all income groups and the impact to transportation options for travel within San Joaquin County and beyond to other regional job centers. Some key points of the discussion will include

- profiles of San Joaquin County commuters and differences with local workers
- analysis of county and city trends in mean and median household income
- trends in rent as a percentage of household income and trends in overall housing costs
- income to poverty ratios

Other invited speakers include housing developers, infill builders, local planners, and other researchers for a panel discussion on the role each can play in strengthening the region's housing security.
